

The First Lesson *Ecclesiasticus* 24:7-15a

With all these I sought rest: and in whose inheritance shall I abide?

The Second Lesson

I Corinthians 12:1-11 (p. 203) CONCERNING spiritual gifts, brethren, I would not have you ignorant. Ye know that ye were Gentiles, carried away unto these dumb idols, even as ye were led. Wherefore I give you to understand, that no man speaking by the Spirit of God calleth Jesus accursed: and that no man can say that Jesus is the Lord, but by the Holy Ghost. And there are diversities of operations, but it is the same God which worketh all in all. But the manifestation of the Spirit is given to every man to profit withal.
