Solemn High Mass of the Resurrection

Summary of Protocols in Place for Indoor Worship

COVID-19 case rates, hospitalizations, and deaths continue to fall, but still remain high. COVID-19 continues to pose a high risk to communities and requires all people and businesses to take precautions and modify operations and activities to reduce the risk of spread.

Please note that the Vestry fully intends to comply with County reopening protocols. The following is a summary; the full Health Officer Order Appendix A (Social Distancing) is posted at both the front and rear entrances and is available on our website.

- Currently, in person participation is limited to 25% of capacity in the Nave which seats 100. With provision for the organist and Zoom wrangler, this allows 23 parishioners. If there are already 23 seated when you arrive, you will be asked to attend virtually and will not be allowed to enter.
- All parishioners, clergy, and support staff (Altar Guild, music, AV) must comply with the following:
 - o Comply with LA County Department of Health <u>Entry Screening Guidance</u> (including a temperature check below 100.4°F)
 - Wear an appropriate face mask at all times that covers the nose and mouth; if instructed by a medical provider not to wear a face mask, wear a non-restrictive alternative such as a face shield with a drape on the bottom edge
 - o Maintain a minimum of 6 feet of physical distance from others when possible; members of the same household may worship together
 - o Sign in with contact information to allow notification in the event of potential exposure
 - Notify the Junior Warden or any member of the Vestry immediately if symptomatic or diagnosed with COVID-19 (this is voluntary for members of the congregation, required for clergy and support staff)
- No eating or drinking is allowed within the building other than as necessary for the conduct of services.
- As a reminder:
 - Please place your offerings in the basin as you enter; to avoid "passing the plate," no collection will be taken at the Offertory.
 - o For Communion, form a single-file line. You will receive Communion standing; the Celebrant will place the Host into your hands.

Thank you for helping to keep your fellow parishioners safe as we once again enjoy the privilege of celebrating Mass within the walls of our beloved Pioneer Church!



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
Collect for Easter Day

For those attending remotely: Please take a moment of silence to realize the presence of Jesus Christ in your soul and make your spiritual communion.




