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with the angel a multitude of the heavenly host praising God, and saying, Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace, good will toward men.




Nicene Creed

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I BELIEVE in one God the Father Almighty, Maker of heaven and earth, And of all things visible and invisible:






General Confession



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



- 3. You may receive only the Host of itself, either in your hands or on your tongue. Our Lord is equally present in either Form.

Please replace your mask as you return to your seat.




St. John 1:1-14
