

filled: and they took up of the broken meat that was left seven baskets. And they that had eaten were about four thousand: and he sent them away.







For those attending in person, we have resumed the customer of kneeling or standing at the Altar Rail to Receive. Here are the various Ways of Receiving:

- 1. Receive the Host into your hands, or directly onto the tongue. Receive directly from the Chalice, guiding it gently by the base.
- 2. Receive by Intinction, receiving the Host into your hands and leaving it there; the Deacon will take it and dip it in the Chalice and place it onto your tongue.
- 3. You may receive only the Host of itself, either in your hands or on your tongue. Our Lord is equally present in either Form.

As a precaution and courtesy to others and for your own safety, we respectfully request that in the event you are currently suffering from a cold or other communicable illness, please refrain from receiving from the Chalice.

For those attending remotely: Please take a moment of silence to realize the presence of Jesus Christ in your soul and make your spiritual communion.



The elections were as follows: Fr. Valentini and Melissa Buckley were elected to serve on the Standing Committee. Fr. McCune and Robert Jones were elected to serve on the Consistory Court, and Deacon Yeager was elected as an Associate Judge.

Bishop Rasch made one-year appointments of Fr. Swan and Lisa Cavaretta to the Standing Committee, Bishop Bulloch as Treasurer and Lisa Cavaretta as the Diocesan Secretary. Parish reports were given. It was a fruitful Synod!

2nd Quarter Mite Box Offering (April-June) was contributed for a grand total of \$113.00. Thank you to all who participated! The Mite Box Offering was forwarded to the Diocesan Treasurer for Mission work in the diocese.
